DECISION No. 0222 /D/MSP/SG/DMPHD CONCERNING  
THE BAN ON SMOKING AT INSTITUTIONS AND  
SIGNIFICANT FACILITIES OF THE MINISTRY OF PUBLIC  
HEALTH

THE MINISTRY OF PUBLIC HEALTH

*In light of the Constitution;*

*In light of Law n°64/LF/23 of November 13, 1984, concerning the protection of Public Health;*

*In light of Decree n° 77/180 of June 6, 1977, concerning the organization of the Ministry of Public Health;*

*In light of Decree n° 88/772 of May 16, 1988, concerning the organization of the Government;*

*In light of Decree n° 88/774 of May 16, 1988, appointing the members of the Government;*

DECIDES

ARTICLE 1: *Counting from the date of the signing of this decision, it is strictly forbidden to smoke on the premises of institutions and significant facilities of the Ministry of Public Health.*

ARTICLE 2: *For the purposes of this decision, the following are considered to be institutions and significant facilities of the Ministry of Public Health:*

- *Premises accommodating central and outlying offices of the Ministry of Public Health;*
- *Hospital facilities in the public sector;*
- *Healthcare facilities in the public sector;*
- *Public schools for the training of healthcare personnel.*

ARTICLE 3: *Office managers of the Ministry of Public Health, Provincial public health delegates, Provincial and Departmental hospital directors, Heads of Departmental offices of Public Health, Heads of Provincial and Departmental Preventive Medicine units, Directors of public schools for healthcare training, District*

*Chief-Physicians, managers of Health Centers and Urban dispensaries are all charged, within the scope of their competency, with the application of this decision.*

ARTICLE 4: *This decision is to be registered, then published in the Official Journal (Journal Officiel) in French and English, with notification hereof to be given anywhere where the need may arise. / -*
