

**Regulation 11/2016 (20 May) of the Minister for National Development  
on the fees applicable to the measurement of tar, nicotine and carbon-monoxide emission of cigarettes**

Under the power delegated by subsection 8 (4b) of Act XLII of 1999 on the protection of non-smokers and on certain rules of consuming and distributing tobacco products, acting within my duties specified by paragraph 9 of section 109 of government regulation 152/2014 (6 June) on the duties and competence of the members of the government, with the agreement of the minister of national economy acting within his duties specified by paragraph 1 of section 90 of government regulation 152/2014 (6 June) on the duties and competence of the members of the government, I make the following regulations:

1. Schedule 1 contains the amounts of the fees payable for the procedure of the consumer protection authority in relation to the sampling of tar, nicotine and carbon-monoxide emission of cigarettes, the laboratory test fees and other test fees (hereinafter together: fees).
2. The fees must be paid by bank transfer or cash payment mandate to the budget appropriation utilization account of the Hungarian Authority for Consumer Protection (hereinafter: Authority) held at the Hungarian State Treasury under number 10032000-01494879-00000000.
3.
  - (1) The fees must be paid within thirty days from the effective date of the decision confirming that the customer must pay the fees.
  - (2) The Authority issues an invoice regarding the fees paid, and sends it to the customer within fifteen days of payment.
  - (3) Out of the paid fees, the laboratory and other test fees constitute the income of the Authority, the sampling fees also containing the price of the samples are the income of the metropolitan or county government office that obtained the sample.
  - (4) Within 30 days from the payment of the fee, the Authority transfers the part of the fees that belongs to the metropolitan or county government office to the relevant metropolitan or county government office that obtained the sample.
4. This regulation comes into force at 4pm on the day it is published.
5. This regulation serves the purpose of compliance with Article 4 (6) of Directive 2014/40/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 3 April 2014 on the approximation of the laws, regulations and administrative provisions of the Member States concerning the manufacture, presentation and sale of tobacco and related products and repealing Directive 2001/37/EC (4).
